Abstract	The letters of John A. Bullock, while not voluminous, are nonetheless a valuable resource for Hunterdon County History. They are interesting letters that tell the story of the Bullock family, a prominent family of two successive members of the Bar in the county. The letters also contribute to the understanding of the impact of the Civil War upon this family and the Hunt. Co. community at large.
Biological Notes	John A. Bullock (1847-1929), was the son of prominent Hunterdon County attorney Edward R. Bullock, of Flemington. He pursued a career as a printer in his early years but read law and passed the bar in 1869. In 1872 he married his wife, Eliza A. Van Fleet, of Flemington. He is mentioned in Snell's <i>History</i> <i>of Hunterdon and Somerset Counties</i> (published in 1881) as a "promising and rising young lawyer."
Scope and Content	This collection contains 16 letters written to John Bullock during the summer of 1865. The majority of them are from his mother, Jannet Bullock. Included are letters from other family members during the same time period. Legal notifications and supporting documents are also enclosed.
