Abstract: This collection is comprised of an assortment of legal documents: indentures/deeds, insurance and mortgage records, and correspondence and dowry transactions from Hunterdon County families.

Biographic Note: Sister Beatrice Fleischbein forwarded these papers on behalf of a former superior, deceased at the time. The person who had possession of the documents is unknown.

Scope and Content: The folders are organized by similarity of content and then by connection between family names. For example, the cemetery plot sold to John Pittenger is contained with the mortgage and insurance papers of Pittenger – Vanderbelt. Folders one through four house deeds, mortgages and insurance papers. The fifth folder contains three dowry receipts for the Apgar/Compton/Fox families.
