Scope & Content / Abstract:

Abstract: This collection consists of correspondence to Elizabeth Vosseller between the years of 1919 through 1940. The majority of the correspondence is in regards to her work with the Flemington Children's Choir School or as her ongoing work as an author. The collection is important to those researching Ms. Vosseller's background as an author or historical information on religious choir direction during the 1930's.

Scope and Content: This collection of correspondence to Miss Elizabeth Vosseller, of the Flemington Children's Choir School, covers the years of 1919 through 1940. The majority of the papers are dated in the early 1930's. Correspondence generally falls into two main categories: responses to Miss Vosseller's requests for religious hymnal information and references to books on religious themes including hymnals being written by Miss Vosseller. Responses are from a variety of sources. The correspondence is arranged alphabetically first by correspondent, and then by date.

Context:

Name of Creator: Elizabeth Vosseller

Administrative / Biographical history: Elizabeth Van Fleet Vosseller was born on December 20, 1874, in Flemington NJ. She was the daughter of Elias and Julia A. (Sleeper) Vosseller. also of Flemington, NJ.

Throughout her lifetime. Miss Vosseller was a very active member of the Flemington Presbyterian Church. She was the co-founder of the Flemington Children's Choir School, a school for religious children's choral groups that gained national acclaim in the early part of the 20th century. Throught his school, she is credited as having a greater influence upon the youth of Flemington as almost any other peron in the history of the town.

In addition, Miss Vosseller was an author and acknowledged expert in the field of administration of children's choirs. She authored several national publications, including her best known work, "The Use of a Children's Choir in the Church, It's Methods and Practical Value".

Miss Vosseller passed away on December 31, 1939.
