Abstract: The collection primarily consists of 91 glass plate negatives of people and places in and around the Readington Village section of Readington Township, New Jersey. All images were photographed by Daniel B. Cole of Readington around 1916. The collection also contains two (2) compact discs containing digital images of 54 of the photographs in the collection, developed out prints of 54 of the photographs, and two (2) Microsoft Publisher files of a history of the Readington Reformed Church on the occasion of its 275th anniversary along with many of the photographs. The compact discs, prints and Publisher files were created around 2002-2003

Scope and Content: The subjects of the photographs depict life in Readington in the early part of the 20th century. Subjects include farm scenes, houses and outbuildings, the Readington Reformed Church and people. People photographed include members of the Lane, Hageman, Robinson, Van Pelt, Vail, Welch, Cole, Hardenberg, Davis, Mattison, Wycoff, Cox and Apgar families.
