Stangl Pottery

Topic of Annual Meeting – 2 pm March 28

Stangl dinnerware and giftware, sold throughout the United States, had its origins in Flemington. Today there is much interest in the various pieces and patterns rendering Stangl pottery highly collectible.

At 2 p.m. on March 28 at the Flemington Womens Club the Hunterdon County Historical Society is pleased to present its Annual Meeting featuring four guest speakers and focusing on Stangl pottery. Harvey Duke lectures, does appraisals, researches and writes in the field of American pottery. His most recent book is *Stangl Pottery*. Fulper pottery expert, researcher Gordon W. Gray, a guest speaker at the Fall 1982 Society meeting, will present a 1936 film showing Stangl pottery being manufactured. Irene Sarnecki began working as a decorator at the pottery in 1948 and quickly became supervisor of the decorating department, later supervising bisque, finishing and other departments. She also designed many Stangl dinnerware patterns including the popular Blue Daisy, First Love, Orchard Song, Rooster, and Town and Country. Rosa Verglianetti began working at Stangl circa 1938 as a Stangl pottery decorator and supervisor's assistant in the decorating department. She was present when the Birds of America series was first introduced.

Johann Martin Stangl came to work at Fulper Pottery in 1910 as chemist and plant superintendent and subsequent to William Fulper's death, bought the company 1930. Stangl Pottery officially closed on 1 November 1978, having produced many pieces of collectible pottery.

A question and answer period will follow the speakers' presentations. Some of you are welcome to present a piece of pottery for examination and/or identification.

Historical Society meetings are always open to the public. Mark Sunday, March 28 at 2 p.m. on your calendar and plan to attend.

Recently, the awards ceremony was held on Saturday, 5 December, 1992, at the Commission's Eighth Annual Conference, and honored were Ronald L. Becker, Thomas Fleming, Donald Pettifer, William C. Wright and the Hunterdon County Historical Society. Kenneth V. Myers, HCHS President, accepted the Award on behalf of the Society, from Richard Waldron, Commission Director.

AWARD OF RECOGNITION

With its 1992 Award of Recognition the New Jersey Historical Commission salutes the Hunterdon County Historical Society for the many services it provides to its members and the public at large. In particular this award acknowledges the care the Society has taken of its manuscript collections and the unique way in which it makes them accessible to the public.

Founded in 1885, the Hunterdon County Historical Society is the state's third oldest historical society and its fifth oldest historical organization of any kind. The society maintains a museum of Hunterdon County history and an extensive library, and has published the *Hunterdon Historical Newsletter* for twenty-seven years.

Its manuscript collections consist of tens of thousands of items of personal correspondence, business and institutional records, and voluntary- and service-organization records. The collections illuminate more than two centuries of history of Hunterdon County and surrounding areas. The society has organized and cataloged its collections carefully according to professional archives standards, and it has published descriptions of many of them in its newsletter, providing the public with easy, inexpensive access to them.

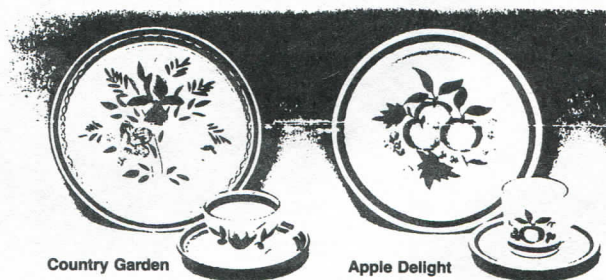

1738 Voter List for Hunterdon County

The 1738 voter list is one valuable resource for genealogists to establish whether their ancestor was in Hunterdon County by that date. At that time the County encompassed a much larger area – all of what is now Hunterdon, Mercer, Morris, Sussex and Warren Counties.

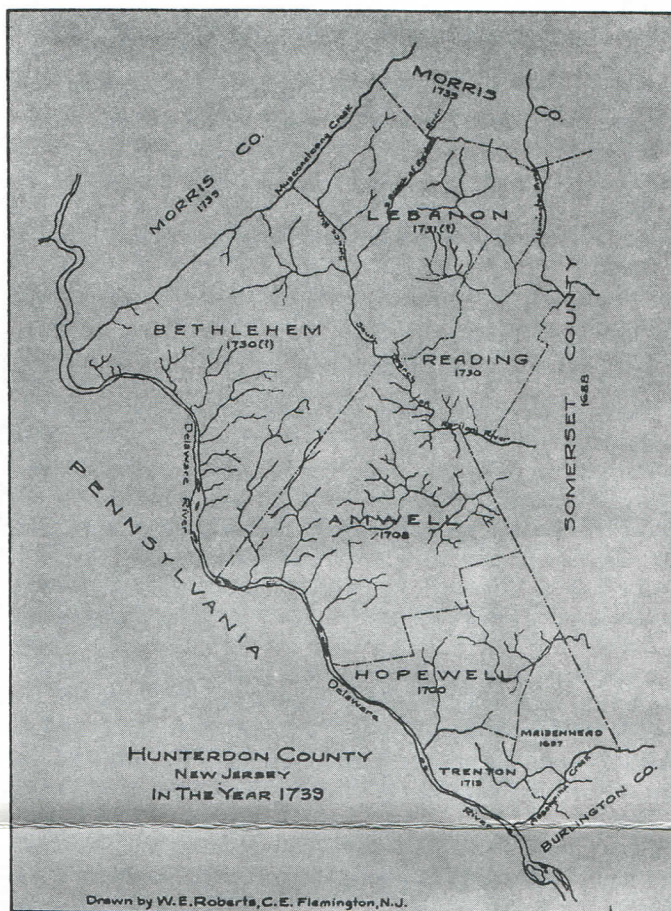
The men whose names appear on the poll-list were landowners eligible to vote and elect General Assembly representatives from among the candidates: John Emley, Benj'm Smith, Daniel Coxe, Josh Peace, Abram VanHorne, Jno. Coate, and Marten Reyarson.

The 1738 poll-list appears on pages 192 and 193 of *History of Hunterdon and Somerset Counties, New Jersey*, compiled by James P. Snell and published in 1881. There it is in its original order, with the comment "from the promiscuous order in which the names occur, it is nearly certain that the election was held at only one place." The list of voters is identified as, "Pole of Freeholders of the County of Hunterdon for Representatives to serve in General Assembly of the Province of New Jersey for the County of Hunterdon, taken *per* Christopher Search, one of the Clerks, Oct(ober) 9, 1738, Before David Martin, Esq., High Sheriff."

Member Marfy Goodspeed, Goodspeed House Histories, having found the list useful, rearranged the names in alphabetical order for her own use. She donated a copy of her revised arrangement to the Society and it is reproduced here as an aid for historical and genealogical researchers.

What's a "Jimmy Cane"?

In 1923, when Edward W. Hunt and his wife, Winifred McClelland Hunt of Lambertville bought several tracts of land in the City from Christopher F. Solliday and his wife Bertha Reading Solliday also of Lambertville, they naturally received a new deed to their property. The first tract began on the public road leading from the New Brunswick turnpike to Hopewell. The neighbors were George A. Kohl, George L. Titus, John H. Smith and Robert Fleming (formerly Thomas Pidcock) and the brick yard lot formerly Abraham Coryell's. The last and eleventh course was "south twenty-nine & a half degrees east (the wind is blowing almost a jimmy cane April 25th) seventeen chains and ninety seven links to the place of beginning." The grantor was the only son of Calvin Solliday and his wife, Louisa, who had inherited the property from her grandfather, Christopher L. Fisher. Fisher had originally purchased this piece of land from Alfred Everitt and his wife on 2 April 1869 when this same course description is given. Unfortunately the transaction when Everitt was the buyer is not recorded in Hunterdon County so we cannot determine how long this weather report was included in the deed. Can one of you tell us what a "Jimmy Cane" wind is?

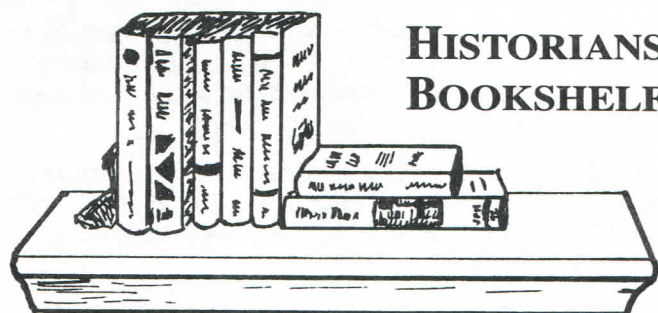
