Notes

The Collection has been sorted according to the principles of the Society of American Archives, and the Association for State and Local History. The first and most important principle is to keep the original order.

The Collection contains no personal material on D. Howard Moreau; all of it is in connection with his duties as editor and publisher of the <u>Hunterdon Democrat</u>.

Hubert G. Schmidt wrote a weekly column for the <u>Democrat</u> for 150 weeks. In the Collection are carbon copies of the original manuscripts. Marginal notes in Schmidt's hand indicate that they were first sent to H. E. Deats, possibly for correction. There are 87 manuscripts that are missing from the numbered sequence, and 24 that were not numbered. For convenience in identifying and indexing, these 24 have been given a letter, A to X. The rest are missing.

There are two manuscripts marked #6, which have been designated as "Copy A" and "Copy B", again - for indexing purposes. To add to the confusion, one copy has p. 2 of #4, and repeats "Raritan", "Holland Brook," and "Kingwood" that appears in #6, copy B. (See p. 3 of the inventory.)

Amanuscript usually consisted of three pages. Less $\underline{\mathtt{may}}$ indicate it is incomplete.

Where a bundle requires more than one folder, it is marked "Bundle - Folders 10-15", for example. The number of items marked on each folder indicates the number of items in that folder, not the number of items in the bundle.
