Title: Historic American Buildings Survey  
Hunterdon County Entries

Extent of the unit of description: 1 box; 2 linear feet

**Scope & Content / Abstract:**

The Historic American Buildings Survey is a documentation of buildings of architectural significance in the nation's history. It was initiated as a WPA project in the late 1930s and additions are continuing to this day. Documentation of a building may include large scale architectural drawings, photographs, written historical and descriptive data, photo captions, and "supplemental" which seems to be card file index cards. The collection at the Hunterdon County Historical Society consists of ¼ inch to 1 ft. scale architectural drawings of all of the Hunterdon County buildings having such drawings. The Society's collection consists only of photographs and drawings.

Plate size of the drawings is approximately 16 ½ inches x 20 ¼ inches. Most photographs are 8 inches x 10 inches.

**Context:**

Name of Creator: National Park Service

Administrative / Biographical history: There was a note with the collection which read: "Purchased from the Library of congress, Washington, D.C. 1965. Partial grant from the Clinton Women's Club, Clinton, N.J." It is presumed that this was a museum purchase by the Society. The note gives an inventory, and the collection is now missing photographs for the Union Hotel, Flemington, the John Reading House, Flemington, and the Holcombe House, Lambertville. The Library of Congress online catalog, available at <http://www.loc.gov/pictures/collection/hh/> indicates that no architectural drawings were made of these buildings.
