Title: Guy Bell Photographs

Scope & Content / Abstract:

Abstract: This collection consists of photographs spanning three generations of the Bell-Stout family from the late 19th to the mid-20th century. The majority of the images are studio portraits and various photography which captured family life at the Bell family home located at 41 East Main Street, Flemington, NJ. Only a minority of the images are identified. The collection highlights the town of Flemington, NJ as a central subject in the celebration of holiday parades and festivities at the turn of the century. Special items include the "Bells and House" photographs, Bell and Stout family crests, Stout Family Tree, class picture of 1953, copy of a family bible page, photo album labelled Dorothy K. Stout, and other miscellaneous photographs ca. 1882-1977. This collection would be of great interest to anyone researching the Bell-Stout family and/or Flemington, NJ from 1882-1977.

Scope and Content: There are 597 folders separated into 12 series. The collection has been arranged according to identified photographs, in series, by photographic subject and theme to include Guy Bell, Jr., Louise Bell, Dorothy K. Stout Bell, Guy Bell, Sr., and Harry Stout photographs, as follows:
