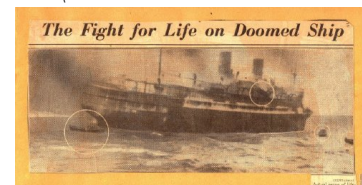

Identity Statement:

Title: Anna Knispel Evans Collection
 Extent of the unit of description: 1 box; 2 linear ft.

Scope & Content / Abstract:

This collection includes records of Anna Knispel Evans, of Quakertown, NJ. It is comprised of completed scrapbooks, unfinished pages, and news clippings concerning current events from the time period of 1934-1954. Subjects include the Morro Castle Disaster, the Johnstown Flood, the Lindbergh baby kidnapping and subsequent trial, and international news items. The collection would interest anyone researching these subjects or topics of interest in the requisite time period.

Context:

Name of Creator: Anna Knispel Evans

Administrative / Biographical history: Anna Knispel Evans (1922-2017) was born in Franklin Township, Hunterdon County, NJ on April 5, 1922, daughter of August and Caroline Hunt Knispel.

Anna resided most of her life in Flemington, NJ before moving with her daughter to Harmony Township, and then later to Union Township, where she died on November 30, 2017.

Anna graduated from Flemington High School in 1940. She worked at many places over her long life. Most notably, she was the secretary to the first Chief of Police in Flemington, NJ. This was a twenty-four hour, seven day a week job, as the Police Department at that time was located in her home at 54 North Main Street, Flemington, NJ.

Some of the additional places Anna worked for included the Flemington Auction Market, Railway Express Agency, New Jersey Power & Light, Hunterdon County Extension Service, the County of Hunterdon, and Bass Transportation Company.

The other business most associated with Anna and Bart was "Evans Christmas Trees." Here, the two sold Christmas trees to most of Flemington, NJ, along with homemade wreaths and other holiday décor.

Among her civic and other activities included being a member of the VFW Auxiliary, the American Legion Auxiliary and the Order of the Eastern Star.
