Her mother, Florence Susan (Spragg), had been a schoolteacher and her father, Thomas Earl, was an accountant. After her father's death in 1918, Jane and her mother spent summers in Toronto, where Florence's sister lived, and after Jane's graduation from high school both Jane and Florence relocated to Canada, where Jane lived and worked until her death in around 2004.
