Title: The George Plum Papers
 Extent of the unit of description: 13 boxes; 7.75 linear feet

Scope & Content / Abstract:

Abstract: The George Plum Papers consist of correspondence, photographs, maps, postcards, and ephemera, including WWII army manuals and historical pamphlets, 1937-1985. The correspondence is primarily from Plum to his mother, and describes his daily routines and general activities for certain periods of his life, including his active duty in World War II.

Plum was an avid photographer, and the extensive photograph collection ranges from images of family and friends, to Flemington-area homes, businesses, and landscapes, to freelance photographs sold to newspapers. The maps in the collection are partly of the Flemington area but also include maps of various portions of Europe during the World War II era.

This collection may be of interest to anyone researching the life of George Plum and his family, and the photographic history of the Flemington area.

Name of Creator: George Plum

Administrative / Biographical history: George Plum (1920 -) grew up in Flemington, NJ, and attended Flemington High School before becoming a freelance photographer. He was drafted into World War II and trained at Camp Kilmer, Fort Bragg, and Fort Dix. He was trained in automechanics and authorized to drive military vehicles. He also authorized checks of goods entering the camp. He was stationed throughout Europe during the war, including in Italy and Germany. After the war, he moved to Connecticut, raised a family, and

continued to work as a photographer. He donated his papers and photographs to the Historical Society in 2007.
