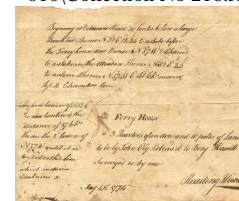

Title: The Cathers-Davison Papers
Extent of the unit of description: 4 boxes and 1 oversized drawer; 1.25 linear feet

Scope & Content / Abstract:

Abstract: This collection is comprised of genealogical & geographical notes and research by Austin LaBarre Davison, Jr. (1909-1991). It includes original deeds, mortgages, articles of agreement, correspondence and ephemera concerning the Reading, Howell, Rittenhouse, Case, Scarborough and related families, primarily from the mid-18th to mid-20th centuries. Mr. Davison was the nephew of C. Lloyd Fell, a former county clerk and recorder of deeds in Hunterdon County for 17 years. Mr. Davison & Mr. Fell were descendants of the forenamed families. The information contained in this collection will be of interest to genealogy researchers of the family surnames Reading, Howell, Rittenhouse, Case, Scarborough, and allied families, as well as place studies of Stockton, Prallsville, Amwell & Delaware Townships, Hunterdon County, NJ.

Administrative / Biographical history: These papers, collectively, were the work of research, notation, and collection by Austin L. Davison (1909-1991), a noted artist and collector of Americana who resided in several places in Hunterdon County throughout his lifetime. Upon the passing of Mr. Davison, much of his personal collection of papers passed into the care of Mr. Carl Cathers, of Stockton, NJ. Mr. Cathers donated both his own collection and that of Mr. Davison to the Hunterdon County Historical Society in 2014.
