<i>4 pages found loose in the Rebecca Hampton scrapbook appear to be indices created by an unknown reader documenting the names found in the ledger, items and prices listed in the ledger, and an incomplete index to articles and sources found in the scrapbook. These pages are written on the back of correspondence from the 1940s.</i>
