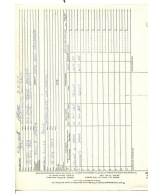

Identity Statement:

Title: Apgars in the Civil War
 Extent of the unit of description: 2 boxes; one linear foot

Scope & Content / Abstract:

This collection consists of the working papers of descendants, who fought in the Civil War, of the Apgar family as reported in the multi-volume genealogy "The Descendants of Johannes Peter Apgard" published by the Apgar Association, 1984 et. seq. Each descendent is reported on a family group sheet, with the same identification number as is used in the published genealogy. The numbering begins with the 11 children of Johannes Peter Apgard, although some of the family group sheets have an initial 1 for Johannes Peter. The genealogy will serve as an index to this collection and should be used in conjunction with it.

For a number of descendants there is additional information, such as photographs of gravestones, pension records, history, birth and marriage certificates, newspaper articles etc. Some of that information is not included in the published genealogy.

Context:

Name of Creator: Wayne Apgar
 Administrative / Biographical history: Apgar family genealogists organized the family into a multi volume genealogy published in 1984. The Apgar Association is focused on researching the descendants of Friedrich 'Fritz' Epgert, who was discovered to be the patriarch of the Apgar family in 2002, as well as hosting reunions. Wayne Apgar in this collection focus on researching Apgar family soldiers who fought in the Civil War.

Structure:

System of Arrangement: Numerical according to descendent numbers as given in "Johannes Peter Apgard and His Descendants". This collection is ordered by generation rather than by line of descent.
