Scope & Content / Abstract:

This collection contains 37 folders and encompasses genealogical interests and records of Wayne W. Apgar. The collection includes activities of the Apgar Family Association, notes on Apgar genealogy, and non-Apgar ancestry of Wayne W. Apgar.

This collection is related to collection 3.001.187, which contains the working papers for the chapter on Descendants of Conrad Apgar which appears in the four volume work "Descendants of Johannes Peter Apgar". It is also related to collection 3.001.189, Apgars in the Civil War. Together, these three collections supply a great deal of information for any researcher of the Apgar genealogy.

Name of Creator: Wayne Apgar
 Administrative / Biographical history: Apgar family genealogists organized the family into a multi volume genealogy published in 1984. The Apgar Association is focused on researching the descendents of Friedrich 'Fritz' Epgert, who was discovered to be the patriarch of the Apgar family in 2002, as well as hosting reunions. Wayne Apgar in this collection focus on researching Apgar family soldiers who fought in the Civil War.
