This collection contains business and personal correspondence of the Grandin family of Clinton, NJ, from approximately 1709 to 1965. Most of the records date from 1800 to 1920. The highlights of the collection include medical records and the journal account of John F. Grandin from 3 March 1782 to 25 January 1783 while sailing on a Privateer.

Other interesting groups of records Include personal family correspondence of Elizabeth Grandin, John Grandin (1721-1777), John F. Grandin (1760-1811), John F Grandin (1827-1889), Mary Grandin Newell (1762-1849) and Philip Grandin (1731-1791); financial records and genealogical papers.

This collection would interest anyone researching either the Grandin family in particular or the household and farm life of the late eighteenth and early ninetenth century.

Administrative / Biographical history: Elizabeth Grandin (1889-1970) was born in Hamden, NY, but later came to live in New Jersey. A descendent of the influential Grandin family, one of Hunterdon County's oldest families, Grandin attended Miss Dana's School in Morristown NJ and later studied in Paris, New York, and Madrid. She operated art studies in both Paris and New York City, and maintained an apartment in Greenwich Village for many years.

In mid-career, Ms. Grandin returned to Clinton, Hunterdon County, to care for her ailing sister and remained there for the rest of her life. She settled in Clinton, and was instrumental in opening the Grandin Library, and also taught art classes at her art studio. She was very active in Clinton and the surrounding area and was a supportive member of the community until her death in 1970.
