Title: Stout and Young Papers, 1853-1937
 Extent of the unit of description: 3 boxes; 1.25 linear feet

Scope & Content / Abstract:

This collection is a group of materials, primarily photographs, that document several generations of the Stout and Young families of Hunterdon County, NJ. The photographic portion of the collection covers the Stout family through two generations from 1860 to the turn of the Nineteenth century, then follows through the intermarriage into the Young family. Manuscripts in the collection include correspondence to and from various members of both families, and diaries from several family members. This collection would interest any researcher of either the Stout or Young families in Hunterdon County.

Context:

Administrative / Biographical history: Augustus Young was born on February 13th, 1847 in Greenwich, New Jersey to Newton Young and Margaret Skillman Wilson. He was a local merchant who resided in East Amwell, New Jersey from the 1860s to the 1890s. He passed away in 1913 in Elizabeth, New Jersey

Mary Stout was born on May 17th, 1844 in East Amwell, New Jersey to Nathan Stout and Mary Ann Fisher. She married Augustus Young on February 10th, 1870 and lived in East Amwell until his death.
