Scope & Content / Abstract:

Scope and Content: The collection consists of three series of items pertaining to the Hunterdon County Park System. The first includes (i) 5 folders of papers related to the Hunterdon County Park System, including park programs and land acquisitions; (ii) 3 folders of racing magazines found during the demolition of the Flemington Fairgrounds. The second series includes 11 folders of photographs of George Bloomer, Echo Hill Park, Camp Watchung, and the South Branch Reservation (prior to or at the time of acquisition). The third series contains (i) collection of photographs and reports about Camp Echo Hill and South Branch Reservation; (ii) program of the 50th Anniversary of Unit No. 1 Northeastern Breeders Association Annual Meeting; and (iii) photos and personal items of the Melick family and farm.

Abstract: The collection comprises certain papers of the Hunterdon County Park System from 1954-1992, including (i) forms and promotional material relating to park events; and (ii) acquisitions of land for the Sourland Mountain Reservation, Union Forge, and the Teetertown Ravine. The collection also contains photographs of George Bloomer (the founder and owner of Bloomer Nurseries on Route 31 that is now the site of the Hunterdon County Arboretum); park properties and events; and racing magazines found by Ranger Kiovsy during the demolition of the Flemington Fairgrounds. The collection also includes memorabilia and photographs of the Melick family and their farm. This collection would be of interest to anyone interested in Hunterdon County parks, youth programs or scouting.
