**Identity Statement:**

Title: Records of the League of Women Voters of Hunterdon County

Extent of the unit of description: 4 Boxes; 1.5 Linear feet

Scope & Content / Abstract:

Abstract: This collection includes documents that represent the League of Women Voters of Hunterdon County. The gathered materials highlight important events for the organization as well as political events that took place in Hunterdon County. There are also published works by the organization, news articles related to various events and information on voting within the county. The collection is geared to those researching Hunterdon County history, as well as women rights within the county. It offers insight into the political atmosphere of the time and the events that took place during the time that would shape Hunterdon County seen today.

Scope and Content: The materials in the collection are related to the League of Women Voters in Hunterdon County. It holds a large collection of news clippings of events with the local government. Published works on school districts and various surveys of the county. The collection also holds important documents such as meeting minutes, treasurer's reports, bulletins, etc. Membership lists for various years of the organization are found within the collection. A historic scrapbook held a large number of news clippings and other documents of the organizational history.

The collection also holds information on the County Planning Board, from background to its creation, and includes different publications surrounding the board and the Equalization of Assessments. There are numerous news articles that surround the Planning Board for Hunterdon County found within the collection.

Context:

Administrative / Biographical history: The League of Women's Voters was founded in Chicago in 1920. The organization focused on Women's right to vote issues and the responsibilities they had as voters. Multiple chapters would be founded across the nation, and in 1948, one opened in Hunterdon County. It provided voter information, planned local political events, and promoted the rights of women to vote. It encouraged more participation in governmental civic activity and offered women opportunities to be a part of the organization.
