Title: Housel Family Photograph Album
 Extent of the unit of description: 1 box; .5 linear feet

Scope & Content / Abstract:

Abstract: This collection includes the contents of a family photograph album, in the order of image appearance in the album. The primary family is identified by the donor as the Housel Family of Pleasant Run, although many of the images are from allied families such as Carkuff and Van Doren. Only about 50% of the images have an identification. Few of the images are dated, but the range is estimated from ca. 1880 to ca. 1960. This collection would be useful for genealogical or historical inquiries of the Housel, Carkuff, and Van Doren families of Hunterdon County, NJ.

Context:

Administrative / Biographical history: Housel is an old and well established family name in Hunterdon County, NJ. According to Goodspeed (Goodspeed Histories New Jersey History and Genealogy: The Housel Family Tree), Casper Housel was the first verified Housel in New Jersey, an immigrant from Neuwied, Germany. Variations of the family name have appeared over the years including Hausschild, Hauschildt, Houshall, and others. By the time of the photographs that appear in this album, the family appears to be well into the sixth or seventh generation since Casper came to New Jersey. Unfortunately no other identification came with the images of this album other than those supplied with the page of each image.
