Title: Herman Deinzer Papers, 1948-1987

Scope & Content / Abstract:

This collection is comprised of records from the Deinzer family of Clinton, NJ. Most of the collection consists of music composed by Herman Deinzer, and the majority of the sheet music was composed for a Memorial Mass in honor of Elizabeth Deinzer, Herman Deinzer's wife. The mass included music titled Agnus Dei, Uxor Mea Post Mortem, Amen, Morning Prayer, Benedictus, Credo, Kyrie, Gloria Sancus, and Lord's Prayer.

Also included is miscellaneous music that Herman Deinzer composed, including six folders of unidentified sheet music. Some of the titled music includes Abschied Vom Wold, Bach Choral, Elesie, and Schicksals Quell Haelerlin.

Other items included in this collection are some family records, photographs, music programs, school records, letters, and newspaper clippings.

Context:

Name of Creator: Herman Deinzer

Administrative / Biographical history: Herman Deinzer was born in Germany in 1905 and moved to New Jersey where he had four children with his wife Elizabeth Deinzer. He was a composer and singer and composed music for the 'original' Hunterdon Symphony. He also sung bass in several choral groups, and wrote music for and performed in several Hunterdon County churches. His musical scores and writing are chiefly remembered for the funeral Mass and memorial service he produced to honor his wife Elizabeth in 1981. Herman Deinzer passed away in 1986 in Clinton, NJ.
