**Location** Doric House: Vault 1

**Description** The collection comprises personal papers of Mr. Bush, ranging from the 1970's until his death. The collection includes his diaries, manuscripts of his fiction and essays, research notes, correspondence, financial records, and photographs. In particular, Mr. Bush's articles and research notes provide valuable insights into the history of southern Hunterdon County and many of the families who lived there.

The Egbert T. Bush Papers consist of:

- (i) 26 diaries and memorandum books;
- (ii) 65 folders of handwritten or typed materials;
- (iii) 10 folders of financial records;
- (iv) 2 folders of published works or advertising documents;
- (v) 18 folders of newspaper articles;
- (vi) 18 photographs.

The collection provides information on Stockton and other towns and villages in southern Hunterdon County as well as the peach business prevalent in Hunterdon County during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, and ways of life during this period.
