IN MEMORIAM — DALE SIMMONDS MOREAU

Acquisition and renovation of the Doric House is chiefly due to the efforts and zeal of Miss Helen B. Large and her Co-Chairman, the late Mrs. D. Howard Moreau, who tipped the scales for its preservation as the Society's new home when the issue was in doubt.

The Doric House as a library and historic house museum is a fitting tribute to the late Hiram E. Deats, our Librarian and Secretary for 50 years; and to the late D. Howard Moreau, who rejuven-

ated the 86 year old Society in 1952 and who, in 1962, inaugurated the Deats Cataloging Fund to make available for research the Society's large and valuable local history and genealogical material which was greatly enhanced in 1963 through the generosity of the Deats heirs by the gift of over 3000 books, mss., genealogical records and artifacts from their father's collection which now ranks our Library as one of the best local history and genealogical collections in the State.

DORIC HOUSE RENOVATION PROGRESS REPORT

Considerable progress has been made since March, 1971 despite mounting labor and material costs.

Renovation was planned in 3 phases: (1) adaption and repair of modern 1 story addition to the 1846 house; now completed and open as our Deats Library and Kase-Rockafellow Manuscript-Newspaper Room.

Phase No. 2 scheduled for 1972 is interior restoration of the 1846 house. Phase No. 3, to follow: exterior renovation entailing careful alligatored paint removal and repair of the 125 year old

original ship-lap siding.

Landscaping and erection of the Joachim Hill decorative cast iron frontyard fencing and 19th century style replica wooden latticefencing and gazebo for the rear garden and flagstone paving as well as erection of the old Flemington style gas street light will be done as practicable.

Phase No. 1, the Greek Revival style wooden covering of the modern cement block library wing, was designed by Architect Carl Espenscheid and executed by Carpenter Hugo Markert has been completed together with a new front "picture"

window paned with old wavy glass.

Library shelving and the large "breakfront" bookcase, gift of the Deats heirs, are in place as well as a similar book case from the Deats Flemington Junction residence are now in our Manuscript Room, gift of T.C. Merritt, our member and proprietor of Flemington's "Turntable Junction" historic restoration area.

Floors in both rooms have been tiled in Travertine asbestos by the Loth Company, Trenton, installers of the original "Doric House Restaurant" flooring.

Color layout of the library is white walls and ceiling with Williamsburg Palace Guardroom Green woodwork trim and Raleigh Tavern Chinese Red background for two recessed rare book display cabinets. File room passage is in Colonial Yellow. All paints made for us by Turco Paint Co., Phila., as was the "Barn Red" wood trim in the Manuscript Room.

The Kase-Rockafellow Manuscript-Newspaper Room required a new ceiling and cove molding installed by Bayard Kemble. Formerly the Doric House Restaurant kitchen, it is transformed beyond recognition! Lighting is by fluorescent tubes. Five metal newspaper cabinets housed here are a gift of the Hunterdon County Democrat as are the bound volumes of this newspaper and its predecessor back to 1825.

The handsome 1867 bronze crank handle bell on the Library entrance door is the gift of Charles T. Deats as are 5 pairs of Victorian metal handles

on the manuscript case drawers.

The library wing is topped by a new tarred asphalt roof by J. Strober & Sons, Ringoes. A new Byrant gas-steam furnace and electric water heater were installed by Kenneth Sutphin and 2 new radiators in the Manuscript Room were installed by Charles A. Smith. Protective iron rear ground floor window grills are by Sam Hall and the handsome 2 inch thick cherry front door was refinished and restored by Louis Lang, New Hope, Pa. (Lacking: original silver-plated knocker and original 4 by 6 inch mortice lock and door handle and knob which so far we are unable to locate for replacement).

Research in preparation for Phase No. 2 (interior decoration and furnishing of the 1846 house) has been assisted by Selden's "Interior Paint of the Campbell-Whittlesey House" (Rochester, N.Y., Landmark Society of Western New York) (A similar Greek Revival House study) and by consultation with authorities in the same field: N.Y. Metropolitan Museum American Wing; Franco Scalamandre, weaver of historic fabrics for America's historic restorations; National Trust for Historic Preservation: Historic American Buildings Survey of the Library of Congress; Independence Hall, National Park Service; Dewey Lee Curtis, Curator, Pennsbury Manor; Lady Mander, Britain's National Trust (Eastlake furniture-William Morris wallpaper for Vosseller-Hopewell-Landis Room).

Landscaping plans are being made for flagged rear garden planted with old fashioned Victorian roses, flowers and shrubs incorporating the 19th century lattice fence and gazebo. A box bush has been given by Edward Serridge, others are needed. Cast iron garden furniture and fountain are also

sought.
