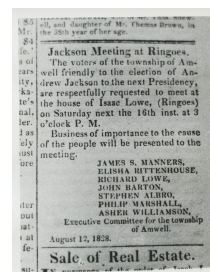

Description A collection of photographs and slides associated with the restoration of the James W. Marshall House in Lambertville, which took place between November of 1968 and August of 1970. It includes photographs of the extensive renovation, most of which was focused on the outside of the house. The collection also includes photos of other structures in Lambertville, artifacts from the museum, and gravestones in the local cemetery.

This collection would be of value to those interested in James Marshall, the Marshall House Museum, or Lambertville buildings.

Dates of Creation	Administrative Biographical History	James W. Marshall was born in Hopewell, NJ, in 1810 and moved to this house in Lambertville with his family in 1816. He lived there until striking out as a carpenter in 1834. In 1846, he discovered gold at Sutter's Mill outside Sacramento, CA, while constructing a sawmill, and he is credited with kicking off the California Gold Rush. He never profited from his discovery and died penniless in 1885.
