Description The George Bushfield Papers comprise the personal papers and photographs of George I. Bushfield from the late 1940s until 1965. The collection provides information on Readington Township history, in particular the Stanton section, and is divided into 5 series consisting of 46 folders of handwritten or typed materials and 95 photographs.

Series 1: Correspondence and documents from the Readington Tercentenary Committee;

Series 2: Notes, correspondence and articles on Readington Township history;

Series 3: Correspondence relating to the Hunterdon County Historical Society;

Series 4: Miscellaneous personal papers;

Series 5: Collection of 95 photographs exclusively relating to Readington Township. This includes images of historic homes from 1964 and 1965 as preparation for a proposed book on Readington Township.

The collection would be useful to anyone researching Readington Township or historic homes located therein.

George I. Bushfield was born in Stanton (Readington Township, NJ) on January 13, 1900. He attended Stanton's one room school, graduating in 1913; Flemington High School, graduating in 1917; and Columbia College (now Columbia

University), graduating in 1922. He worked for the New York City advertising firm of Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborne (now BBDO), leaving in 1953 to return to Stanton. Bushfield joined the US Navy in 1942, where he was in charge of publicity for nationwide recruiting and induction. He left the Navy at the rank of Lieutenant Commander. In 1944 during his service in Washington, he met and married Elizabeth Hayden. After he returned to Stanton in 1953, he focused on civic responsibilities. These included: (i) the Hunterdon Medical Center's first board of trustees; (ii) Readington Township's first planning and zoning boards; (iii) helping to form the South Branch Watershed Association; (iv) Readington Township's Tercentenary Committee; (v) leading protesters against a jetport in Readington in 1967; (vi) leading the fight to prevent the Transcontinental Gas Pipeline from condemning property for a right of way through Stanton. Bushfield passed away on February 12, 1969. He is buried in Newell Cemetery.
